Rates have sky rocketed and the workers who support these establishments have suffered. People do not forget and corrections in real money and karma are inevitable. 
A WORD OF CAUTION




MENDOCINO COUNTY MAP Mendocino Coast 3








NAVARRO RIVER STATE BEACH


Navarro Beach Campground is the best of all waterside worlds. Fall asleep to ocean songs. Be a neighbor to swimming holes and translucent river currents. Inhale the fresh bite of salt and forest. Cherish views of truly jaw dropping sunsets and partake in the joys of a small scale campground where you can adequately remove yourself from overpopulation anxiety. This beach campground sits beside a stretch of driftwood scattered sand that adjoins the mouth of the Navarro River. Navarro provides a concise 10 site spot and you stake your claim via the more classic first-come first-served approach. This means - plan to grab your spot early and don't wait to pull in at 11pm with no back up plan. Bring layers, but expect summer heat that differs from the normal coastal camping experience and enjoy the payoff of being close to so much skin cooling, soul warming water. The sweet canopy of second growth redwood giants is a stroll away. Be aware both preditor and prey walk this beach by day and night. Protect your loved ones - both two legged and four legged. Rangers and life guards can arrive in minutes.

In the gournet deli an assortment of homemade salads, sandwiches, International dishes and health food with all the necessities for an afternoon picnic or vacation home or RV meal are showcased. Fresh coffee and espressos are made from organic beans. Camping and



outdoor cooking equipment, bait and tackle, nautical gear and firewood are among the on-going list of supplies stocked for the great outdoors. The wine selection represents Mendocino's finest wineries. Gasoline and motor oil is also sold. A favorite, with a long history, this seaside restaurant with lofty cliffside views of the crashing surf is one of Mendocino's finest restaurants. Owner/chefs Tony & Lisa Geer create inspiring and romantic dinners. Comforting soups and garden fresh salads (garnished with flowers) are a work of art. Bistro dishes (from \$25) and dinners (served a la carte with fresh vegetables from \$35) include fresh fish stew in white wine, tomato, fennel and saffron broth with Crostini and Aioli, potato Ginocchi with gorgonzola, and pan seared wild king salmon. The wine list, sumptuous desserts, crackling fire and view make for exceptional memories.

ALBION RIVER CAMPGROUND and MARINA

Beneath the Albion River Bridge on a broad river valley flat that once was the home of the first tidal water powered sawmill in California (circa1852) is the Albion River Fishing Village and Campground. Available for big groups and open camping, the fees vary for tent or car camping, \$50 for water, wifi and electricity and \$60 for full RV hookups (\$5 day use and \$2 per dog). There are hot showers and bathrooms. Schooner's Landing Selkie Cove Campground is just up river and is a membership only "Eco Club".





HERITAGE HOUSE

One of the most famous destinations on the Mendocino Coast is the Heritage House, located just south of Little River. In 1949 Lauren and Hazel Dennen purchased the property and began creating Mendocino's first country inn. Film stars Alan Alda and Ellen Burstyn brought new meaning to aging gracefully by arriving as young lovers and returning as grandparents in the motion picture "Same Time Next Year;" filmed on location in 1971.

Today the Heritage House is owned by a billionaire and his management group. A lot has been lost since the days the Dennens greeted guests and local business people with kindness and appreciation. Sixty nine cottages, rooms and suites are scattered over 37 acres of gardens along the rugged Pacific coastline. The Heritage House Resort also features a spa to soothe aching muscles. The restaurant offers breakfast, lunch and dinners. There is also a full bar.

LITTLE RIVER INN

There is quite a selection of accommodations to choose from at Little River Inn. In the historic Inn (circa 1853) are Victorian rooms with commanding views overlooking Van Damme Cove with its surf-tossed rock outcroppings. To the north, nestled into the hillside, are two-story rooms that open out onto spacious balcony walk-ways with sweeping ocean views. To the south, amid the meandering gardens, are a variety of units, each with a commanding view of the seascape, a cozy woodburning fireplace, and some have a two-person luxury tubs. Massages or body treatments are on-site in the day spa and guests can also enjoy a round of golf followed by a feast in the Little River dining room's garden setting. Entree ingredients come from Mendocino county farms and ranches, seafood from Noyo Harbor and vegetables harvested from local gardens. Ole's Whale Watch Bar, open nightly, serves cocktails and a bar menu. Room service is offered from both the dining room and bar.

VAN DAMME STATE PARK and BEACH

If people are acting crazy or the stress of the day has gotten to you then drive through or walk slowly along fern lined Little River under the coastal forest canopy of Van Damme State Park. Take it all in - slowly. . . breeze rustle the leaves and the distant ocean waves. Steelhead hide in the dark pools, owls hoot at night beneath a heavenly tapestry of stars. Here, humankind, the caretaker, has fulfilled their godly task and preserved a beautiful natural setting to relax and rejuvenate in. There are 74 tent or car/RV campsites with water and picnic tables (no electricity - bring portable solar panels). Rates are \$45 / night which includes one vehicle (additional vehicle \$10), day use \$8,

GLENDEVEN INN, COBBLER'S WALK and "THE LODGE"

One of northern California's first bed and breakfast inns was opened by Jan and Janet DeVries in 1979. Today the inn is under the ownership of two partners - John and Mike. Glendeven's Maine-style architecture is set back on a headland meadow with the bay of Little River in the distance. Some nights you may be lulled to sleep by the sound of a buoy or hear waves rolling on the beach.



There are 20 rooms, some with fireplaces with rates from \$265/2 plus tax. The day begins at Glendeven with a generous full gourmet breakfast of fresh squeezed organic orange juice, hot or cold fruit dish, home baked pastries, or-



ganic eggs from the inn's flock of chickens and locally roasted coffee or tea. In the evenings the fire crackles and a fine piano in the sitting room awaits.

Across the highway are the 10 rooms and suites of Cobbler's Walk bed and breakfast (rates from \$225 - \$295/2) and just west down the drive is the Beach Trail Cottage, a vacation rental with 2 bedrooms (\$300 / night - 2 night minimum 2 guests max). Just to the north of Glendeven is the "The Lodge" on Highway 1 where an additional 10 rooms from \$295 /2 await. Restrictions are no pets and 2 guests per room for all 4 destinations. John and Mike also provide a wine bar

and numerous other amenities. They do love animals and own a herd of llamas, flock of chickens and help out with various animal causes.



BREWERY GULCH INN

"The 10-rooms of Brewery Gulch Inn is a worthy tribute to the ancient redwood trees used to build it, with A central common room and dining area built around a huge foursided fireplace made of glass and welded steel plates, the view down-slope to the pounding Pacific is stupendous."

This grand lodge, set like a gemstone just south of Mendocino in a sylvan setting overlooking Smuggler's Cove and the Pacific Ocean is full of magic. From the organic gardens fresh produce is served the guests year-around. The

on-site herb garden, forest mushrooms, garlic beds and heirloom
apple orchard are all utilized by
the Inn's chef to create appetizers and dinner entrees. Innkeepers Guy and Sarah state "From
its inception, Brewery Gulch Inn
was intended to be an environmentally-responsible steward of
this amazing parcel of land; increasing native habitat and encouraging bio-diversity."

Luxuriously appointed guest rooms (from \$150 to \$295/2) are

individually designed to capture views of the ocean. Each room features seating in comfortable leather club chairs in front of the gas-lit fireplace, down comforters, phone with teleport, clock radio with CD player, and armoire with color television. The bathrooms have a tub/shower combination; several have either a jacuzzi or soaking tub for two. An organic gourmet breakfast and afternoon wine and buffet of appetizers are served.

Kind and generous visionaries, Jeff and Joan Stanford have pioneered many healthy trends in Mendocino County. They have created a world class vegan-vegetarian restaurant, promoted alternative health care and diet, are home to large organic gardens cocreated with John Jeavons, and Matt Drewno complete with heirloom seed bank of non-



GMO varieties, built a large indoor garden swimming pool, and purchased a fleet of kayaks and "water world" catamarans for adventures up the Big River estero. Last but not least, they rescued horses, llamas, dogs and cats. You and your children should really enjoy it here.

Each of the rooms are tastefully decorated with comforters and an array of unique antique furnishings and fixtures. All have private baths, televisions, VCR's, coffee makers, telephones, sundecks and toasty fireplaces (from \$265/2). A full breakfast is served in the Ravens restaurant with organic produce from the certified organic gardens. You can canoe Big River estuary with the tides and spot osprey and river otter. The lodge is surrounded by thick forests of fern, fir, bull pine, redwood and cypress. Ask about the special mushroom tours and learn about the nueral net in the soil beneath you. It is tough being a pioneer and bucking complacent people. You can armor-up and become arrogant and opinionated, be grumpy, but when all is said and done you can say "I did it my way".

MENDOCINO GROVE

The secluded entrance to Mendocino Grove just south of Mendocino on State Highway 1 is very inviting. Entering and exiting the main entrance is dangerous as vehicles whip up and down this stretch of Hwy 1 with it's blind curves. Drive up to the top of the hillside and you get your first glimpse of what appears to be a yuppie FEMA camp with all manner of liberal lifestyles and refugees. Check in at the concierge tent and tour to your tent site. This enchanting forest setting is a natural sanctuary from the stresses of life. Here you can bask in the healing energy of Mendocino Grove with its distant views of Mendocino Bay. There are over 30 comfortable tent sites, with hot shower spa, dog park and hiking trails. MENDOCINO: Historic Victorian Village by the Sea

Mendocino, located 120 miles north of San Francisco, is a coastal village with a "small town personality," which was named by Spanish explorers for Cape Mendocino. The population is 800 plus and Mendocino is on the National Register of Historic Places. It can be reached from the southeast by State Highway 128, from the northeast by State Highway 20, the north/south by state Highway One or by traveling the remote and picturesque Comptche-Ukiah Road. Rarely does the temperature go over 89 degrees, however days can be windy and winter storms fierce and exciting.


The cleanest air and clearest light blesses visitors and the artist community who create here. Visitors escape the summer heat and stay in a multitude of hotels, bed n breakfast inns, state park campgrounds and vacation rental homes. Demand from refugees is high, so realestate is pricey and tight. Lots of places to park your adventure van or RV along the cliffs or in the forests. Keep your vehicle and loved ones (2 n 4 legged) secure during the day and locked at night.

POINT CABRILLO LIGHT STATION

Only God knows how many lovers, laying in bed late at night in Mendocino, have looked out their windows into the darkness and stars and been inspired by the flickering beacon of the Point Cabrillo Light Station to the north. Savior of lives, angelic light at dangers ledge, lighthouses around the world have been restored and preserved by well organized groups. This light and fog horn station was originally built in 1909 and restored in 2001 by the Point Cabrillo Lightkeepers Association in coordination with the State Department of Parks and Recreation. The lighthouse, gift shop, lightkeeper's house museum and the marine science exhibit are open every day of the year from 11am - 4pm. The 300 acres of the park and the multiple trails throughout the grounds are open from sunrise until sunset! Soooo . . . don't be disappointed by the 1/2 mile walk through Point Cabrillo Park from the parking lot into potential fog or rain - call to be sure of the hours or check the website. Paths to secret little coves of mirror calm and clear water to stormy seas will reveal mysterious splashes of life in fur and fin in grottos and along rocky crags. Be smart - be safe!

RUSSIAN GULCH STATE PARK

Russian Gulch State park is located 2 miles north of Mendocino on the west side of Highway 1. The campground is very small and quiet with 30 family campsites, one which is handicap accessible; a hike and bike camping area; and a 40 person / 10 vehicle group tent camping area. The park is fully developed with hot showers and flush toilets. Each campsite has a food storage locker, fire ring with cooking grill and picnic table. The campsites can accommodate tents, trailers up to 24 feet long; or RV's up to 27 feet long. Rates are \$45 / night which includes one vehicle (additional vehicle \$10), day use \$8.

There are scenic hiking trails in the park, one which leads to a small but majestic waterfall, that weaves through coastal forests in moderate terrain. A picnic area is situated on the headlands portion of the park near a scenic "blow hole" where visitors can enjoy views of the misty ocean spray and magnificent sunsets.

Noyo Harbor today is a working harbor and a great place to charter an excursion boat, learn to fish, dine at numerous restaurants, stay at world class hotels or more moderate motels, stay in your van or RV or berth your boat in the marina.

FISHING and WHALE WATCHING on the MENDOCINO COAST

Whale watching season north of San Francisco is usually from December through May. The southbound advanced guard of California Gray Whales including bulls and pregnant cows usually reaches the Mendocino Coast in mid November and December with stragglers as late as March. Cows will give birth in Baja. The northbound advanced guard of California Gray Whales including mothers with newborn calves usually reaches the Mendocino Coast in March and April with slower moving mothers and calves as late as May.

The best vantage points for whale watching are from peninsulas or points that extend well-out into the Pacific from the main continental land mass. Along the Mendocino Coast there are numerous observation points along the cliffs, bluffs and headlands. The Mendocino Headlands, the Noyo River jetty and driftwood scattered north beach offer hours of seaside entertainment as fishing boats come and go, sea lions and sea gulls play in the river's mouth and seasonally migrating whales spout and breach off-shore.

During the annual migrations, whale talks by fishing boat skippers, naturalists and rangers are hosted. Those who want a close up can sign aboard a party or fishing boat at Fort Bragg. Excursions usually cost \$50 - \$250 per person for adventures just off the Mendocino - Fort Bragg coast or north into the wild and dangerous Lost Coast. Bring cold weather gear, a camera, film, water proof cell phone, and if necessary sea sickness pills. Happy Whale Watching!

CONTACT!!!

One of the early documented contacts with a baby grey whale occurred with Mendocino artist-divers J.D. Mayhew and Byrd Baker. Their love and efforts were instrumental in helping to save the California Grey Whales from extinction. Byrd and J.D. were men of great courage and passion - we need more such artisan leaders to inspire the connection we



have with our telepathic brothers and sisters of the sea. There is a plan to build a \$30 million dollar museum on the Noyo Headlands of Fort Bragg to exhibit the huge skeleton of the Blue Whale salvaged from a nearby cove. You can visit the Noyo Center for Marine Science, Fort Bragg's own "aquatic Smithsonian Institute" and discover the mysteries of whales or bring back a souvenir from the world famous Glass Beach Museum.



NOYO CENTER for Marine Sciences and Natural History Museum

The Noyo Center began years ago when a group of environmentalists wanted to create a research facility dedicated to the study and preservation of marine mammals, birds and whales. Philanthropists helped fund a showroom on Main Street Fort Bragg and the Crow's Nest, a small A-Frame exhibit and a tide pool aquarium on the Noyo Headlands.

Interest in the Noyo Center was catalyzed when the largest whale on earth washed up in a rocky cove just south of Fort Bragg. Slowly the enormous female blue whale decomposed and workers salvaged her bone by bone. This whale sparked the idea for a larger museum to be built to house the enormous skeleton on the Noyo Headlands. Today the board, workers, volunteers and donors are raising money to build a solar powered museum large enough to exhibit the Blue Whale skeleton. Their goal is \$30,000,000.

Is it practical to raise this kind of money for an environmentalist project when homeless people are dying on the sidewalks of Fort Bragg? THE WORLD FAMOUS GLASS BEACH

At the end of Elm Street in Fort Bragg is the world famous Glass Beach. There is no admission and folks travel here from all over the world looking for treasure. For years it was a dump or "trash beach". First horse and buggy; then residents would back their pick-up trucks to the edge of the cliff and unload their trash. Fire would burn away anything that wasn't enduring. The ocean would flush, rush and crush the contents: each tide and storm would reduce the rubble. What remains today are little pieces of broken




glass of various colors and sizes; some very rare and valuable. This is Glass Beach. The Sea Glass Museum, in the historic Union Lumber Company Store, is a great place to explore the history of Glass Beach and purchase a souvenir of rare treasure collected by sea glass and Glass Beach expert Captain Cass Forrington. His museum is a must see in Fort Bragg. There is excellent parking at the beach and a great hike for you and your dog.

The symbology of Glass Beach is expressed by local minister Greg Esher of Grace Church, a place of worship and "hubs and routes" emergency shelter for the less fortunate. Greg states "God can take the trash of your life and His refining turbulent love can wash the filth away, deposit it in the deepest part of the ocean never to be seen again. He can carry away the pain as far as the "east is from the west" and your life will be changed from trash to treasure, your mess into a message, your test into testimony, your stumbling block into a stepping stone, and your brokenness into blessings."

For hundreds of years these headlands were the sacred hunting ground of the Pomo Indians. They caught surf fish, rock fish; gathered abalone and mussels and foraged for medicinal plants and seaweed. For decades camping was free here and loggers who worked the woods to the north and recreation vehicle families used to stay for months to fish, get away from it all and sleep under the stars.

But 1987 marked an end to all this. Today's campers will find picnic tables, BBQ firepits, cold running drinking water and primitive outdoor toilets for a \$45 overnight camping fee (additional vehicles \$10) at one of 100 prepared campsites. Sorry, no showers, more improvements are planned and there is an informative resident ranger and evening campfire talks. The Westport Union Landing State Beach offers 2 miles of ocean front with grassy meadows dotted with wildflowers, steep unstable cliffs and sandy beaches. Foot trails and redwood stairways lead down to the sea. Dangerous currents, blue and great white sharks prowl the depths; so be careful with your children and pets.
